Section 3 — Admission Requirements & Enrollment

Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy admits students of any race, color, and national or ethnic origin. Admission is based on academic history, character, family commitment, and space availability. The following documents are required for enrollment:

- Completed application form
- Previous school transcripts and most recent report card
- Current immunization records (or a signed letter of objection — required for all Kindergarten and 7th grade students, and all students new to Florida)
- Official birth certificate
- Copy of Social Security card
- School health examination form
- Step-Up for Students Award ID number (if applicable)
- Current Individualized Education Plan (IEP), if applicable

Enrollment Path

1. Inquiry — Submit a quick inquiry form to begin the process.
2. Tour — Visit campus and meet school leadership.
3. Apply — Complete the formal application and pay the application fee.
4. Acceptance — Participate in an academic review and family interview.
5. Enroll — Complete enrollment paperwork and secure your child's seat.

All prospective students must participate in an initial admissions interview prior to enrollment. This interview allows school leadership to assess the student's academic history, behavioral record, and readiness to succeed at FHA. Families will be notified of admissions decisions in writing.

Section 4 — School Hours & General Information

Daily Schedule

Daily Schedule at a Glance	
8:00 AM	Building opens — students may arrive
8:30 AM	School day begins — students arriving after this time are tardy
2:30 PM	Dismissal
3:00 PM	Latest permitted pickup — no extended day program

Late Pickup Policy

Parents are expected to pick up students no later than 3:00 PM. Students remaining after 3:00 PM will incur a fee of \$15.00 for every 15 minutes, beginning at 3:01 PM. Late pickup fees will be posted directly to the student's account. After three (3) late-pickup incidents, the Department of Children and Families (DCF) will be notified.

Lunch

All students must bring a nutritious lunch to school each day. Sodas, candy, and excessively sugary foods are discouraged. Microwave and refrigerator access is available with staff assistance. Utensils are not provided by the school. Students are allotted a 30-minute lunch period. Fast food deliveries are strongly discouraged. Birthday treats such as cupcakes or cake may be brought in for special occasions with advance notice.

Office Hours

The school office is available Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM, for phone calls, document drop-off, and general inquiries.

Section 5 — Dress Code & Uniform Policy

Uniforms are mandatory at Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy. Our uniform policy promotes unity, discipline, and a focused learning environment, and reflects our commitment to orderliness and respect. Students must arrive in proper uniform. The school will not permit students to complete dressing upon arrival. Students who are out of dress code will be sent home until properly attired.

Approved Uniform Items

Approved Uniform Standards	
Tops	Navy or white polo shirts with the official Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy logo. Shirts must be tucked in at all times.
Bottoms	Khaki or navy pants, shorts, skorts, or skirts. Solid-color denim jeans (no distressing). All bottoms must be worn at the waist with a belt. Modest length required.
Shoes	Closed-toe, non-backless shoes. Loafers, dress shoes, and sneakers are acceptable. No athletic slides, flip-flops, or Crocs.
Chapel Day	Formal dress is required on designated Chapel Days, as communicated by the school office.
Leggings	Solid-color leggings (navy, black, gray, or white) are permitted under skirts only.

Prohibited Items

- Polos without the official FHA logo, or in colors other than navy/white
- Distressed, patched, jeweled, printed, or colored denim jeans
- Pajama bottoms or printed/novelty pants
- Non-khaki/non-navy shorts (athletic shorts, sweat shorts, etc.)
- Athletic slides, flip-flops, or Crocs
- Hoodies, sweaters, jackets, or outerwear of any kind
- Hats, beanies, or wigs
- Excessive makeup or accessories that distract from the learning environment

The school reserves the right to make final determinations on dress code compliance. Uniform purchasing information will be provided by the school office.

Section 6 — Attendance Policy

Regular attendance is foundational to academic success. Students are expected to be present and on time every day school is in session. Absences result in lost instruction that is difficult to recover, and excessive absences may jeopardize a student's academic standing and promotion.

Excused Absences

An absence may be excused for the following reasons:

- Illness, quarantine, or professional health care/therapy from a licensed practitioner
- Family emergency
- Required court appearance
- Death in the immediate family
- Observance of a recognized religious holiday, with prior written parental notification

Absence Notification Procedure

Parents or guardians must contact the school office by 9:00 AM on any day a student will be absent. If no contact is received by 10:00 AM, the school may attempt to reach the parent or guardian. Upon returning to school, students must submit a written note explaining the absence. A physician's note may be required for absences of three (3) or more consecutive days.

Make-Up Work

Students are responsible for all assignments missed during any absence, including homework. Teachers will provide a grace period for completing make-up work, with one day per absence as a general guideline. Work submitted after the grace period may be subject to grade penalties at the teacher's discretion.

Excessive Absences

A student may not miss more than nine (9) days within a nine-week grading period. Students who exceed this threshold and have outstanding work may receive a grade of F (Failing) or I (Incomplete) for that grading period, resulting in no credit. Students with excessive absences throughout the year may be required to repeat their current grade level.

Tardiness

Students must be in their classroom, prepared to learn, by 8:30 AM. Students who arrive after 8:30 AM will be recorded as tardy. Tardiness disrupts the classroom and results in missed instruction. Excessive tardiness will be addressed with parents through a formal conference and may result in disciplinary action.

Early Dismissal

Parents requesting early dismissal must submit a written note at the beginning of the school day. All student releases are processed through the front office. Parents must sign students out upon pickup and sign them back in upon return. Early dismissals are recorded in the attendance record. Students are responsible for all work missed during early dismissals. Parents are asked not to pick up students within 15 minutes of the regular 2:30 PM dismissal time.

MAP Testing Windows

Attendance during standardized testing windows is especially important. The 2026-2027 NWEA MAP Growth testing windows are as follows: Fall (Aug 24 – Sept 4, 2026), Winter (Jan 11 – Jan 22, 2027), and Spring (May 10 – May 21, 2027). Dates are aligned with Duval County Public Schools but include Academy-specific testing and events, and are subject to change.

Progress Reports & Report Cards

Student grades are accessible in real time through Gradelink, the school's student information system. Report cards are issued at the conclusion of each nine-week grading period. Parents are encouraged to schedule conferences at any time if they have questions about their child's academic progress. FHA will not release records or report cards to any family carrying an outstanding balance.

MAP Growth Benchmarking

Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy uses NWEA MAP Growth assessments to create Individual Learning Plans for every student, administered three times per year (fall, winter, spring). Results are interpreted in light of each student's individual learning profile. Parents should understand that MAP scores represent a snapshot of performance on a given day and reflect an ongoing process of growth rather than a final verdict on a student's ability. Parent Conferences

FHA values open communication between home and school. Parents may request a conference with any teacher or administrator at any time by calling the school office or sending an email to administration. We ask that parents schedule appointments rather than arriving unannounced during the instructional day.

Payment Options

Cash, PayPal, and Cash App are not accepted for tuition or fee payments. All charges, including late fees, are posted directly to the student's account through the official payment portal.

Supporting the Mission

Refund Policy

All tuition and fees paid to Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy are non-refundable. In the event of voluntary withdrawal or disciplinary expulsion, no refunds will be issued for amounts previously paid, and families remain obligated for any outstanding balance.

Section 10 — Code of Student Conduct

Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy is committed to maintaining a safe, respectful, and productive learning environment. Enrollment at FHA is a privilege, not a right. All students are expected to conduct themselves with honor, accountability, and respect — on campus, at school-sponsored events, and in all interactions that reflect upon the school community. FHA embraces restorative practices and a belief in second chances. At the same time, clear boundaries and consistent consequences are essential to protecting every student's right to learn and every staff member's ability to teach.

General Conduct Expectations

6. Follow the directions of all staff members promptly and respectfully.
7. Keep hands, feet, and personal belongings to yourself at all times.
8. Raise your hand and wait to be recognized before speaking during structured activities.
9. Respect fellow students, staff, school property, and yourself.
10. No running in hallways, classrooms, or common areas.

Disciplinary Process — Progressive Discipline Model

FHA uses a progressive discipline model rooted in restorative practices and accountability. Disciplinary Infractions (DIs) are cumulative throughout the academic year.

Progressive Discipline Framework	
1st Offense	Verbal warning and/or visual cue (at teacher's discretion)
2nd Offense	Verbal warning, visual cue, and possible loss of student privilege
3rd Offense	Administrative/teacher action — student removed from class for the remainder of the day; must complete academic work with administration
1-3 DIs	Administrative action as described above
3-5 DIs	Parent/teacher conference and In-School Suspension (ISSP)
6 DIs	Expulsion from Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy

All Disciplinary Infraction (DI) forms must be signed by the parent or guardian and returned to the school office the following school day. Failure to return signed DI forms in a timely manner may result in escalated consequences.

Zero-Tolerance Infractions

The following behaviors will result in immediate administrative action, which may include suspension or expulsion:

- Possession or use of tobacco, alcohol, or controlled substances
- Possession of weapons, knives, matches, lighters, or any object used as a weapon
- Physical violence, fighting, or assault of any kind
- Bullying, cyberbullying, or harassment of students or staff
- Theft or vandalism of school or personal property
- Insubordination or threatening behavior toward staff
- Possession of items violating the forbidden articles policy

Forbidden Articles

The following items are prohibited on school grounds and will be confiscated upon discovery. Parents and/or law enforcement may be notified:

- Tobacco, alcohol, drugs, knives, weapons, matches, and lighters
- Sunflower seeds, gum, or candy (unless expressly permitted by administration)
- Laser pointers, toys, games, or trading cards (without express administrative and teacher permission)
- Personal technology devices (tablets, personal computers) — permitted before school, after school, and during lunch only, unless privilege is revoked

Cellphones may NOT be used in class. Parents who need to reach their student during the school day should contact the school office at (904) 521-6530. FHA is not responsible for the loss or theft of personal belongings.

Property Damage

Students who damage, deface, or destroy school property — including textbooks, technology devices, furniture, walls, or equipment — will be assessed a repair or replacement fee. Incidents of damage must be reported to the office immediately. Any student found writing on, scratching, or otherwise defacing school property will face disciplinary action.

Dress Code Violations

Students who are out of dress code will be warned and parents will be contacted. The student will be required to return home and dress appropriately before re-entering the building. Repeated dress code violations will be treated as disciplinary infractions.

School-Family Relationship

The FHA community thrives when school and family values are aligned. In the event that unresolvable conflicts arise between school policies and family expectations, students may be administratively withdrawn. Sincere efforts will always be made to resolve differences before this action is taken.

Section 11 — Health & Safety Policies

Medication Policy

Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy does not employ a school nurse and is unable to administer medication of any kind to students. Students who require medication during the school day must arrange for a parent or guardian to come to campus to administer it during the student's scheduled lunch period. Students who require daily medication should take it before arriving at school or after dismissal whenever possible.

If a student requires a first-aid item (such as Neosporin, Tylenol, or Benadryl) from the school's first-aid kit, the school will contact the parent or guardian for verbal approval prior to administering it. An email confirmation from administration will be sent to the parent.

Emergency Procedures

In the event of a medical emergency and a parent cannot be reached, Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy is authorized to contact emergency contacts listed in the student's registration file. If the situation requires immediate medical attention, FHA is authorized to transport or arrange transportation for the student to the nearest emergency medical facility or to contact the student's designated physician. The school does not assume financial responsibility for any medical treatment incurred.

Liability

Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy maintains a safe environment; however, families agree to hold the school and its agents harmless for any injury or alleged injury sustained by students while on school grounds or at school-sponsored events. In the event of legal action brought against FHA in which the school is not found at fault, the initiating party agrees to be responsible for any resulting attorney fees, court costs, and damages. All legal matters shall be resolved through arbitration.

Field Trips

Students are encouraged to participate in all school-sponsored activities and field trips. General permission is granted upon enrollment through the signed handbook acknowledgment. Field-trip-specific permission forms may be issued for individual trips. Students who are not in good standing academically or behaviorally may be restricted from field trip participation.

Searches & Safety Investigations

To ensure the safety of all students and staff, FHA administration reserves the right to conduct reasonable inspections of student belongings — including backpacks, bags, purses, and (where applicable) student vehicles — without prior notice. Parents acknowledge and consent to this policy upon enrollment.

Section 12 — Transportation

Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy does not provide school bus transportation. All transportation arrangements are the responsibility of the parent or guardian. The following pick-up/drop-off options are available:

- Parent, family member, or approved carpool driver
- Student walks or rides a bicycle (with parental consent)
- Student driver (high school students with a valid license)

All persons authorized to pick up a student must be listed with the school office and must present a valid government-issued photo ID upon request. If an unauthorized person attempts to pick up a student, the school will contact the parent or guardian immediately and will not release the student until authorization is confirmed.

Parents are responsible for ensuring that transportation plans are communicated to the school office in writing at the beginning of the year or whenever changes occur.

Parent Responsibility

FHA families are partners in the educational process. We ask that all parents:

- Ensure students arrive on time, prepared, and in proper uniform
- Maintain current contact information on file with the school office
- Read and respond to all school communications promptly
- Review student progress regularly through the Gradelink Parent Portal
- Attend scheduled parent conferences and school events
- Support the school's conduct expectations at home and in the community

Photo & Video Consent

By enrolling a student at Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy, parents consent to the use of their child's name, image, artwork, written work, voice, and video likeness for school publications, the school website, video productions, and media releases. Parents who wish to withdraw this consent may do so at any time by submitting a written request to school administration.

SMS & Electronic Communication

Families who opt in agree to receive text messages from Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy regarding admissions, enrollment, school updates, and calendar reminders. Message frequency varies; message and data rates may apply. Consent is not a condition of enrollment, and families may reply STOP to opt out at any time. FHA does not share or sell mobile numbers or SMS opt-in data with third parties.

Section 14 — Acknowledgment & Consent Forms

14A — HANDBOOK ACKNOWLEDGMENT

I understand that this handbook may be updated and that I am responsible for being informed of any revisions communicated by the school.

14B — STUDENT CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE

I understand that enrollment at Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. Academy is a privilege. I grant administration and teachers full discretion to enforce conduct policies, including the issuance of Disciplinary Infractions (DIs), in-school suspension, out-of-school suspension, and expulsion, as warranted. I understand that the school reserves the right to dismiss any student whose actions or attitudes are incompatible with the mission and values of FHA, regardless of where the incident occurs.

Parent/Guardian Initials

14C — SEARCH & SAFETY POLICY

I consent to the school conducting reasonable inspections of my child's belongings, including bags, backpacks, purses, and student-operated vehicles, as necessary to ensure the safety of the school community.

14D — PHOTO & VIDEO RELEASE

I consent to the use of my child's name, image, artwork, voice, and likeness in school publications, on the school website, in video productions, and in news and media related to Father's H.A.R.B.O.R. I understand that the school does not assume financial responsibility for any costs associated with such treatment.

14G — TUITION & FINANCIAL OBLIGATION

I understand that tuition is payable through the school's secure online payment portal, ACH transfer, or major credit card — cash, PayPal, and Cash App are not accepted. I understand that late fees will be assessed for overdue balances and posted directly to my student's account, and that after three late pickups the Department of Children and Families (DCF) will be notified. I understand that all tuition and fees paid to FHA are non-refundable, and that I remain financially obligated for any outstanding balance in the event of voluntary withdrawal or expulsion.
